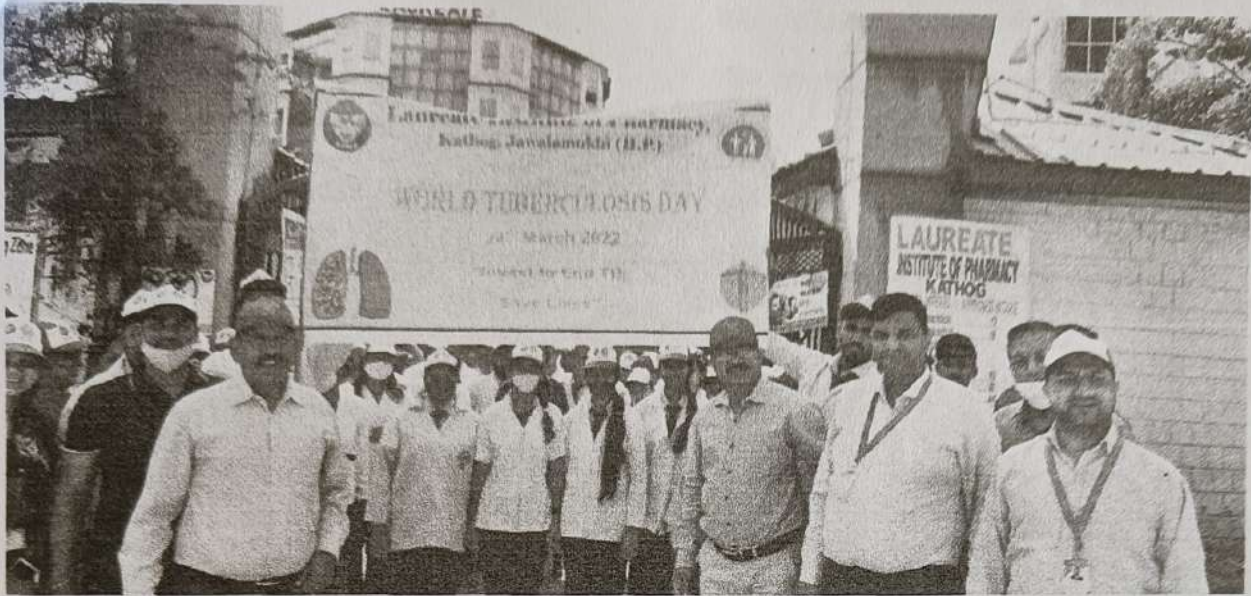
Report of Awareness rally on World Tuberculosis Day
